Dear Parents,

The COVID-19 crisis has clearly impacted the entire country. It has created great challenges for educators across the country. Los Fresnos CISD is making every effort to provide instructional continuity during this difficult time.

Los Fresnos CISD is preparing to roll out at-home instruction that will occur during the shutdown caused by COVID-19. The COVID-19 crisis has caused the district to make an instructional pivot to be able to continue instruction for students.

Students will have two primary options regarding at-home instruction. Students can choose on-line class work or at-home instructional packets.

On-line instruction will open on Monday, March 30 through multiple on-line formats. Instructional packets have been prepared and can be picked up from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday, March 27, Monday, March 30 and Tuesday, March 31.

Packets can be picked up at your child's individual campus. The only exception to this is Resaca Middle School and Los Cuates Middle School packets; these campuses will distribute packets behind Los Fresnos Elementary. Bins for drop-off of completed packets will also be set up at each campus.

Since Monday, teachers have started to contact students through a variety of platforms including email, phone calls, Google Classroom and Zoom. Students and teachers are connecting through mobile phones, tablets, and personal computers. Teachers are scheduling daily times to communicate with their students. Numerous teachers have already reported that lively discussions on a variety of subjects are already taking place on-line.

Parents of students who have not been contacted by their teachers should contact the school office to verify the telephone number or email contact. Additionally, there will be a link on the district website www.lfcisd.net that will provide greater detail into both the on-line and at-home instructional packets.

Finally, Los Fresnos CISD is also presently working to equip campuses with free Wi-Fi that will be available in the parking lots at each campus. The District hopes to have this service up and running by late next week.
